

UNIT 2: but, yet, except, only

1. 'but' and 'yet' are used to join two contrasting sentences.

Example A

Gerald ran as fast as he could. Gerald did not win the race.

Answer 1

Gerald ran as fast as he could **but** did not win the race.

Answer 2

Gerald ran as fast as he could **yet** did not win the race.

NOTE:

'Gerald' is mentioned only once. The tenses in the sentences remain unchanged.

2. 'except' and 'only' are used to highlight the odd one out in a sentence.

Example B

All the pupils have completed their work. Leon has not completed his work.

Answer 1

All the pupils, **except** Leon, have completed their work.

Answer 2

All the pupils have completed their work **only** Leon has not.

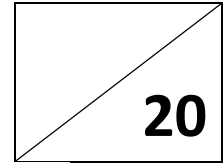
NOTE:

Be careful with the tenses. Remember the verb 'have' in Answer 1 is determined by the plural verb 'pupils'.

The verbs 'have' and 'has' in Answer 2 are determined by 'pupils' and 'Leon' respectively.
