Example 1

I like the colour red. I like the colour blue.

I like the colours red and blue.

Example 2

Ronnie met Mr Tay at the cinema yesterday. Ronnie met Miss Chia also.

Ronnie met both Mr Tay and Miss Chia at the cinema yesterday.

Example 3

Calvin washed his shirt. Calvin also ironed his shirt.

Calvin washed and ironed his shirt.

Example 4

My father is at work. My mother is at work.

Both my father and my mother are at work.

Example 5

The tiger killed the rabbit. The tiger ate the rabbit.

The tiger killed the rabbit and ate it.
