together with, as well as

'together with' and 'as well as' are used when an additional person or persons joins the subject of the sentence.

Example 1

My brothers are going to the market. My sister is going to the market.

My brothers, together with my sister, are going to the market.

Example 2

The company chairman is at the meeting. The company directors are at the meeting.

The company chairman, as well as the company directors, is at the meeting.

Example 3

The oranges are selling at three for a dollar. The apples are similarly priced.

The oranges, as well as the apples, are selling at three for a dollar.

Example 4

The famous hunter trapped the ferocious wild boar. He did it with the villagers' help.

The famous hunter, together with the villagers, trapped the ferocious wild boar.

Example 5

The burglar stole the paintings. He stole some sculptures too.

Together with the paintings, the burglar stole some sculptures too.
